Vibrant Downtown Walla Walla thrives on a harmonious combination of old and new. A peaceful walk through the tree-lined downtown area reveals a functional mix of clothing stores, galleries, tasting rooms, cafes, book stores, restaurants and more. There's an economic balance between agriculture, in the present as well as the past and newer ventures such as technology. Main Street is populated with businesses open for decades, as well as those that just opened in the past year or two. Add numerous pieces of public art on street corners to the variety of prospering businesses in renovated historic buildings and the result is a world-class destination.

This modern experience is set in a historical environment reaching back to the mid-1800s, Walla Walla's Main Street has captured a bit of Americana the community shares with pride. It has also attracted plenty of attention from across the country. The Downtown restoration and preservation effort has been honored with a number of national awards, for food, wine and historic preservation.

Among others, special awards have included selection by the National Main Street Center as a Great American Main Street and being named one of 12 Distinctive Destinations by the National Trust For Historic Preservation. The area was recently named one of the best places to retire by Where to

Retire Magazine. Several years before that, Sunset Magazine named Walla Walla's as the Best Main Street in The West and its Wine Destination of the Year. Top Value Reviews recently named Walla Walla as number 17 on its list of the top 50 Best Small Town Main Streets. The city has also been honored several times as a "Tree City U.S.A."

So relax and stroll through the area; stop at some of the shops, restaurants and sidewalk cafes. There's historic architecture in every direction, many possible routes to walk and a host of seasonal activities to enjoy.

#### Walk Walla Walla

Downtown Walla Walla has a full schedule of events, including outdoor musical entertainment, plenty of public art and art activities as well as numerous festivals that provide opportunities for fun.

Walla Walla Heritage maps are available for a walk through select areas of interest. Tour maps include the Downtown Historic Trail Guide, Fort Walla Walla, Boyer and Pioneer Park, historic homes and other sites in the area. They're available at the Visit Walla Walla Visitor Center located at 26 E. Main St. wallawalla.org or by calling 1-509-525-8755.

ArtWalla is an organization dedicated to making the arts available to everyone. # Soldiers, Pioneers & Indian People

Carrying the Past into the Future at Fort Walla Walla Museum

ong known as "The Cradle of Northwest History," the Walla Walla region maintains a relationship to the past that helps provide its distinctiveness for today's visitors. At Fort Walla Walla Museum, the mission of discovering, preserving and sharing that heritage is an ongoing task. Through a 17-building pioneer settlement, four large exhibit halls, several special events, lecture series, classes and more than 40 living history performances each year, the Museum annually beckons travelers from all 50 states and more than 35 foreign countries. The Museum also features

an engaging Entry Hall loaded with exhibits. Among them, a diorama of Lewis & Clark in Wallah Wallah Country, military displays, Plateau Indian beadwork, heritage dresses, children's hands-on stations, plus restrooms

and a well-stocked Museum Store. Young children also enjoy the wooden play fort on the enclosed grounds.

In 1805/6 the journals of the Lewis & Clark Expedition documented the interac-


tion with the Cayuse, Palouse, Walla Walla and Wanapum peoples. That first contact set the stage for the ongoing relationship between the United States and the Indian people who continue to thrive in their homeland. The Museum portrays this enduring story in a major, dynamic exhibit entitled Through War and Peace: American Military and the People of the Homeland tribes.


Following the early explorers, came the people of the fur trade era. Employees of the Northwest Company followed by the Hudson's Bay Company interacted with members from the Homeland Tribes. While it had to be rebuilt twice, the trader's Fort Walla Walla along the Columbia River existed

nearly four decades.

Marcus and Narcissa Whitman arrived in 1836 and began their missionary work



among local Indian people. Many members of the nearby Cayuse Tribe died when a measles epidemic reached Whitman Mission via the ever-growing numbers of pioneers along the Oregon Trail. This event added to existing friction and led to the killing of the Whitmans and 11 other pioneers by several Cayuse people in 1847. Occasional hostilities continued for nearly a decade until the signing of the treaty in 1855 near what would

become the center of Walla Walla. After two temporary forts, a permanent U.S. military Fort Walla Walla was opened in 1858. While soldiers from the fort were involved in the final battles of the regional Indian Wars, the fort's presence provided peace for more than 99% of its duration.

With peace, the number of newcomers into the area bloomed. Farming pioneers were followed by miners passing through the region on their way to the Idaho goldfields in the 1860s. A community quickly grew around the fort and agriculture became the economic base. Fires and floods sometimes devastated the community, but the resilience of the people served to rebuild the town better than before.

After the turn of the century, a military presence was no longer needed. Except for a brief period during World War I, the post was closed in 1910. A group of local men served in the 146th Field Artillery, one of the most active batteries during WWI. Two of the large 155mm cannons used by this unit are on display. By 1922, the buildings of the fort were turned over to the Veterans Bureau, the forerunner of the modern Veterans Administration. During WWII Walla Walla was the home of an army hospital, air base and POW camp for German soldiers. All this rich history sits amid the vineyards, orchards, and fields of Walla Walla, the playground of the entire region.

We must embrace our past. Heritage is the thread that binds the fabric of our families, communities and nation. It defines who we are and serves as the foundation for our current economy. Enjoy Walla Walla's historic downtown, beautiful old homes and heritage sites. Bring your children and grand-children to see Fort Walla Walla Museum's outstanding collections and exhibits to experience the story of the area's people from the days of Lewis & Clark through WWII.

Fort Walla Walla Museum features new exhibits each year. In 2018, the Museum celebrates its 50th anniversary discovering, preserving, and sharing Walla Walla regional heritage. The special exhibit slated for an

early April open will feature a selection of treasured items from the collection. Also learn about our region's rich heritage of Indian culture, agriculture and much more in our galleries, and step back in time as you stroll through our pioneer settlement – perhaps enjoying some entertainment by our Living History Players, see website for schedule. The Museum Store, features hundreds of items from books, artwork and local specialty foods, as well as something to remember your Museum visit. See what's new at the old fort, your journey into the past and future, begins here.





The Walla Walley embraces music and art. Whether the music is rock or chamber music, the area has much to offer. Art is easy to find, from college campuses to Main Street. Sit back, relax and enjoy concerts, live theater and take a stroll to check out the sculpture and gallery exhibits.

# Music in the air, everywhere

The Walla Walla Symphony continues its second century of performances with its 2018 season. The community based orchestra has played each year since it began in 1907, making it the oldest continuous American symphony west of the Mississippi River. The symphony performance April 10, "Spanning the Centuries," includes Mozart, Tchaikovsky and Ives. A complete season schedule is available at wwsymphony.org.

Each year the symphony performs a family oriented concert, with education and fun for the whole family, as well as great music kids of all ages can enjoy. A fund raising gala is also in the lineup as well as a host of concerts.

Music is suited for outdoor performances. During the summer, downtown you can attend weekend concerts on Main Street. Musical entertainment is often provided during the Farmers' Markets.

#### Walla Walla Chamber Music Festivals

Music fills the streets, coffee shops, tasting rooms, libraries and parks of the area, all throughout the summer festival. A host of acclaimed, award-winning musicians transform summer into an ongoing musical experience. On wwcmf.org, a past festival was described as, "Familiar spaces, the corner coffee shop or bistro, take on new identities when filled with glorious chamber music." It's also an educational opportunity, you can watch rehearsals and gain a whole new perspective on the performance.

The Winter Chamber Music Festival each year fills January with music. Often unlikely musical pairings are put together, such as saxophones or drums with strings for an innovative twist on chamber music. The 2018 summer festival is scheduled for June 7-30 with music in a variety of venues. For more information visit wwcmf.org.

Performances by the Walla Walla Choral Society and Walla Walla Valley Bands as well as concerts by students and faculty at the local colleges provide high quality musical entertainment all through the year. More information can be found at wwchoralsociety.org and wwvalleybands.org.

A variety of musical performances can be found at numerous tasting rooms and restaurants in the area. Other venues in town are Main Street Studios, 207 W. Main St. in the historic Dacres Hotel Building and the Gesa Power House Theatre in a renovated power plant off Rose St. at 6th. This summer, the Gesa Power House Theatre will host two musicals, "Annie" July 27-Aug. 5 and "9 to 5" Aug. 17-26.

#### Rock On, Walla Walla

The area embraces all types of music from chamber music to rock. In August 2015, Walla Walla held a giant series of outdoor concerts: the Gentlemen of the Road Stopover Music Festival, headlined by Mumford & Sons and Foo Fighters. Multiple stages showcased the talents of local and regional bands throughout the festival.

# Theater is alive and well in Walla Walla

Musicals, comedies and drama can be found on stage in several locations. Whitman College's Harper Joy Theater, Walla Walla University, Walla Walla Community College, Gesa PowerHouse Theatre and the Little Theatre of Walla Walla all provide top notch performances throughout the season. #### Film

If you're in the mood for the movies, you have plenty of options. The Grand Cinemas of Walla Walla, 1325 W. Poplar St. offers showings weekdays and weekends. Information: wallawalla.halletcinemas.com. Dayton's Liberty Theater, libertytheater.org, offers



films in a historic venue, 344 E. Main St., Dayton. Milton-Freewater hosts one of the few remaining drive-in theaters in the country, the M-F Drive-In Movie Theatre, 84322 Highway 11 at Sunnyside Rd. It is open weekends in the warm seasons, check availability at mfdriveintheatre.com.

#### Art on the Corner and Elsewhere

Art has a prominent place in the Walla Walla Valley. Downtown Walla Walla's Main Street has numerous pieces of public art, including the very popular "Thoughts Discovered" by Brad Rude at First Ave. A walk along historic Main Street will take you past an assortment of thought provoking installations. Some of these pieces include Squire Broel's "Lights of the Valley," a cast bronze lantern with lights inside at Second Ave.

At Third Ave. in the Baker Boyer Bank plaza, a bronze frog contemplates the fountain. "The Thinker" by Ralph Tretheway strikes the same pose as Rodin's famous sculpture.

In front of the Walla Walla Public Library, on Alder St., is "Matilde on Her Way to the Market," by Nano Lopez, a long-horned cow made up of many textures.


The Whitman College campus also has a number of outdoor art installations. These include colorful totems and a serene basalt archway leading into the meditation grove in the Whitman Glen and more.

In Heritage Park on Main Street you can view "Windows on the Past," a recent project honoring the many ethnic and cultural groups in the area in the time span of 1850-1950. This mural of historic and modern photos on porcelain enamel on steel panels was placed on the 1902 Odd Fellows Temple facade. Visit artwalla.com for more information.

The recently installed "Illuminated Gateway Arbors" by Koryn Rolstad, resides in two locations at the Walla Walla Regional Airport. One is near the tarmac and the other is near the airport entrance.

#### And in galleries

Galleries with fine art on display are everywhere, from downtown Walla Walla to Milton-Freewater, College Place to Dayton. In addition to plenty of outdoor art you can visit more than two dozen galleries throughout Walla Walla and the outlying areas. To the north, Dayton has several including Steve Henderson Fine Art and the Wenaha Gallery. College Place has the Clyde and Mary Harris Gallery at Walla Walla University. Milton-Freewater has several including Arts Portal Gallery.



#### AREA MUSEUMS

Museums in southeastern Washington and northeastern Oregon offer a glimpse of the people and customs of the past. The Tamástslikt Cultural Institute in Pendleton honors 10,000 years of the vibrant history of the original inhabitants of the region. It includes a fascinating past, a rich present and bright future.

Several museums in the local area are restored homes that tell how their families lived in days gone by. Many of the museums host special events, workshops, craft demonstrations and seasonal activities the whole family can enjoy. Fort Walla Walla Museum hosts a troupe of Living History actors who portray influential people from the area's past.

#### Fort Walla Walla Museum

755 Myra Rd., Walla Walla

Located on the grounds of a 19th century military fort, the Fort Walla Walla Museum provides an educational experience for the whole family. The Museum features a pioneer settlement of historic buildings, a military cemetery, beautiful gardens and four exhibit halls housing thousands of artifacts.

The Entrance Building and Galleries feature dynamic exhibits, artifacts and an admission free Museum Store filled with books, heritage gifts, traditional crafts, old-fashioned toys and gourmet foods.

New and upgraded exhibits are shared throughout the year. Open year-round, the Museum hosts a series of activities and events. Museum After Hours is a monthly presentation series touching on topics ranging from regional culture and history to the roles and responsibilities of museums within our communities. The Museum also offers classes for all ages and camps for children during the summer. Special events include Fort Walla Walla Days June 9-10 and Ice Cream Social Aug. 19. Members of the Living History Company portray individuals from the pioneer days weekly April-October.

Whitman Mission National Historic Site Located seven miles west of Walla Walla off Highway 12


Whitman Mission National Historic Site, a unit of the National Park Service, focuses on historical and contemporary relationships between peoples of American and Native American cultural backgrounds. The arrival of American missionaries into the Cayuse Homeland in the 1830s is one example. #### Kirkman House Museum

214 North Colville St., Walla Walla

Today it is a place to tell their story and that of early Walla Walla through per-

#### Frenchtown Historic Site

8364 Old Highway 12

Eight miles west of Walla Walla; Three miles east of Lowden

With walking trails and information, the site preserves the memory of several parts of local history including the former settlement of Frenchtown, the mission and cemetery of St. Rose of Lima and the Battle of Walla Walla, also known as the Battle of Frenchtown.

Frenchtown began as a settlement of French Canadian trappers employed by Hudson's Bay Company and their families in about 1824. Many of those buried in the cemetery are those families.

Prior to the ratification of treaties creating reservations for the Indian Tribes, war broke out, the local battle was part of the larger Yakima Indian War which continued until the fall of 1858. However the 4-day battle at Frenchtown determined the control of Walla Walla and the surrounding lands. It was also the longest military battle in Washington state's history.

The St. Rose Mission Church was constructed on the lower portion of the Frenchtown Historic Site in 1876. It was actively used until about 1900 and removed from the site in 1911.



Dayton also has a Farmers Market, now combined with Blue Mountain Station's Artisan Market Saturdays.


