9:00 AM | COFFEE AT CARTE COFFEE

Start your morning downtown at **Carte Coffee**, a sleek café with exciting brews and a warm, welcoming staff. While your human grabs their signature drink, you'll be outside enjoying the breeze—and if you flash your best "please scratch me" look through the window, there's a good chance you'll earn some extra attention. I've had plenty of luck with that move.

10:00 AM | SNACK STOP AT THE MILL

Next up, **The Mill**. Humans are always going on about the Hawaiian salad, pimento cheese sandwiches, and those smoothies—but I'm here for one reason: Jen. If you know, you know. "Treat Lady" always has something special for her four-legged visitors. Whether you're grabbing lunch to fuel a day of wine tasting or sticking around for a patio hang, this spot is perfect for both lounging and lobbying for one more snack.

10:45 AM | TASTING + TREATS AT SEVEN HILLS WINERY

Seven Hills Winery, located in the historic Whitehouse-Crawford building, is a favorite stop for wine lovers and their dogs. Inside, the space is calm and inviting, with a team that's just as friendly to four-legged visitors as they are to the two-legged ones. While your human explores a lineup of beautifully crafted wines, you can stretch out, soak it all in, and maybe even score a treat from someone behind the bar. (Trust me—it's happened before.)

11:30 AM | SHOPPING AT WAGS TO WHISKERS

Walk off that lounge session with a visit to **Wags to Whiskers**, a locally owned pet boutique stocked with treats, toys, and gear. Whether you're in the market for a new leash, a gourmet biscuit, or a squeaky toy shaped like an octopus, this is the place to find it.



12:15 PM | VINEYARD VIEWS & ROOM TO RUN AT TRANCHE ESTATE

At **Tranche**, there's room to roam—and I take full advantage. While my human settles in with a tasting of their expressive Rhône-style wines, I'm out on the lawn sniffing the breeze, finding the perfect shady spot, or just watching the vines sway. If you come by on a Friday or Saturday evening, you'll catch live music too. It's lively, it's dog-friendly, and it's one of my favorite ways to spend golden hour.

2:00 PM | BEER + PATIO HANG AT FIVE DOLLAR RANCH

Alright, I'm more dynamic than just a winery dog—I dabble in breweries too. And so do my people. **Five Dollar Ranch**, a Southside spot is one of Joe and Ashley's (my people) favorites. They love the laid-back vibe, the IPA options, and the way everyone's treated like a regular (even those of us on paws). The owner, Josh, has something truly special going on there.

4:00 PM | BACK TO WORK AT ALTON WINES

Alton Wines is where I do my best work: greeting guests, posing for photos, and adding just the right amount of charm to every tasting. The architecture is beautiful, the vibe is easygoing, and the wines are meant to be enjoyed —not just admired.
